Joe Vajdos provided the most building up a good lead in the first lap, wilted on the home stretch as Vajdos put on a brilliant finish to win by three yards.


Roy Bucek lost the high hurdles ace to Cummins by a scant six inches, but won the low hurdles by about a yard.


