**BACCALAUREATE SERMON**  
The Processional to Guion Hall for the Baccalaureate sermon, Friday, May 15, will form as follows:  
President Walton, the speaker of the day.  
Minister, Commandant.  
Members of the Board of Directors.  
Deans and Directors.  
Line will form in the lobby of the Academic Building. The formation will be in column of twos.  
The graduating class will form on the lawn west of the Academic Building and

south of the walk, being arranged alphabetically according to courses, those receiving advanced degrees first in line. Students will report to Acting Registrar, H. L. Heaton for assignment to position. The line will form at 9:55 o'clock and the procession will move at 10:15. Everyone is urged to be on hand at least by 9:55 o'clock on Friday morning. Doors open at 9:45. Academic regalia will not be used. Number one uniform will be worn except by students who have permission to wear civilian clothes for the semester.

All candidates for graduation are expected to attend the Baccalaureate program.

**COMMENCEMENT EXERCISES**  
The Processional to the Stadium for the Commencement Exercises will form just east of the Athletic Office. The head of the Column will be toward the south, the procession entering the field through the opening in the east bank of seats.
