Cofer, Longley, Pinson, Gordon to Edit Student Publications for School Session

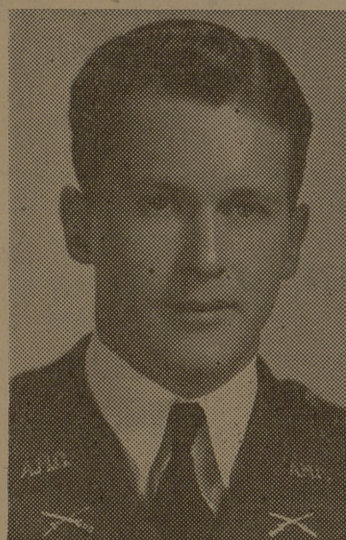

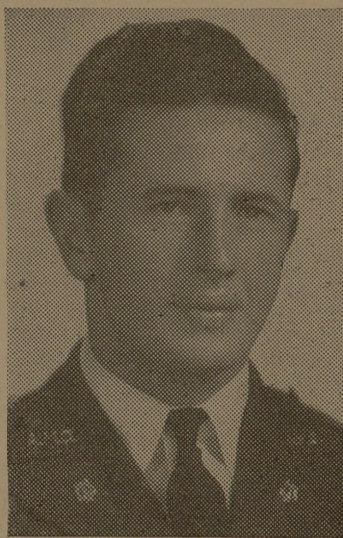
ED GORDON

DAVID PINSON

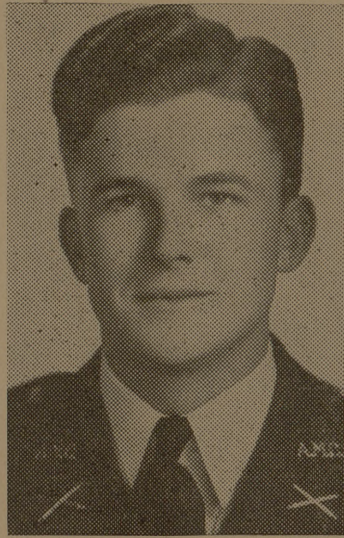
Editing the Agriculturist will be David Pinson, C Troop Cavalry, who was associate editor before Walter Cardwell was forced to re-

REGGIE SMITH

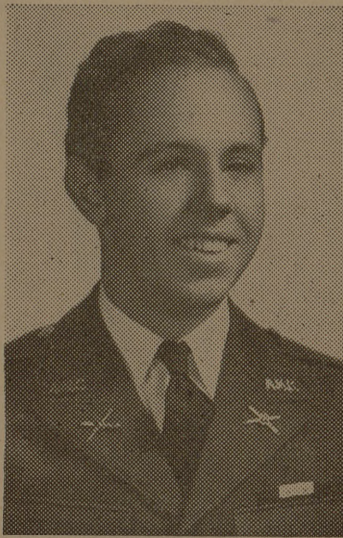

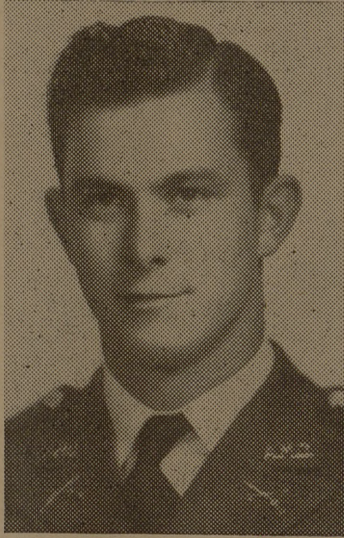
All but two of the American states, the District of Columbia, five outlying possessions and three foreign countries are represented by correspondence students of the University of Wisconsin.

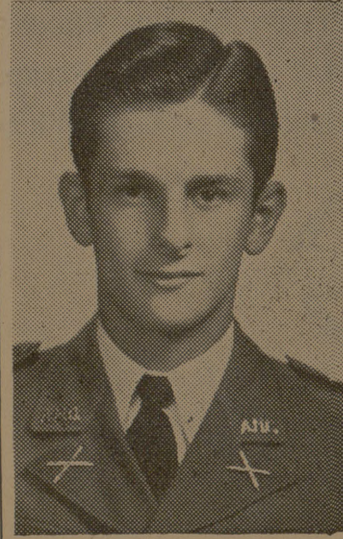
