Let's all show the team that we've got the real Aggie spirit by showing up tonight. They have a tough game ahead of them and your presence will give the team that needed extra pep!


the college hospital with the flu besides having three broken ribs. In that case, Weldon Maples, stellar reserve, will in all probability take Bucek's place in the starting lineup.






