Commodore Rank Asked Restored By Navy for Duration

Restoration of the rank of comnodore has been requested by the Navy as temporary for the duration and legislation to carry out the proposal has been introduced in both the House of Representatives and the Senate.

The bill to restore the grade of commodore was reported by the Senate Naval Affairs Committee without extended debate, but with an amendment which would insure that commodores be subject to Senate confirmation. The comparable rank-brigadier general in the Army-is subject to Senate confirmation.


