E. L. Angell Leaves Post at College For Army Saturday Afternoon, Aug. 8

E. L. Angell, executive assistant to the president of the Agricultural and Mechanical, College of Texas, has been called to duty by the Army with a commission as a major and ordered to report to Fort Custer, Michigan, August first.

Major Angell, native of Denton, received a Bachelor of Arts degree from North Texas State Teachers College. He was connected with the public school systems at Aubrey, Krum and Denton prior to going to New York City in 1930.. He taught one year in Brookyln College and was coordinator of the Children's Village School while attending Columbia University from which he received his Master of Arts defree in 1931.

Returning to Texas, Major Angell was deputy state superintendent for the State Department of Education, then came to Texas A. & M. College May 1, 1936, as manager of Student Publications. In June, 1941, he was made executive assistant to President T. O. Walton.
