Carmen Amayo on November 18 has something in the style of flamenco dancing that will thrill every person sitting in the audience of Town Hall. Her gypsy movements and those of her troupe will have every bit of their gypsy rhythm mixed with the music of

the gypsy. An entertainer in Buenos Aires before Toscanini discovered her, Carmen has won fame in the United States and she will come to the campus with the same thought in mind, that of giving her audience what they want to see and hear.

A. & M.'s own Singing Cadets will be the featured program on December 14 when they present some of the songs that are so well received by every audience at every appearance over the state. The Cadets have been acclaimed one of the best male singing groups in the United States, and previous samples of their music have proven this to the Corps and to the service men on the campus. Popular, classical, semi-classical, and the traditional songs of Aggie land will be featured on the program.

Richard Crooks will bring his fine tenor voice to the campus on January 20 for the enjoyment of the Town Hall audience. Crooks is a national figure in the minds of music lovers, and even those who don't care for music as a rule will enjoy his songs.

A mystic and psychic, Joseph Dunninger has baffled the nation's greatest psychologists. This performer has presented his show of the "super-human" accomplishments of the human mind to six presidents, and his presentation on the Town Hall stage will be of the same unusualness.

The Philadelphia Opera will bring its organization to the stage of Guion Hall on February 21 with a program that will contain good dramatics, beautiful voices, modern settings, and contemporary and understandable English to the classics. A company of eighty-six young people including a small symphony orchestra will be on hand to show the Aggies and service men some of the old dramatics.

Zino Francescatti who appears on Town Hall on March 7 is one of the finest violinists in the world and the famed "Hart" Stradivarius violin as his instrument will testify to his ability as a musician. His program will truly be worth attending.

The seventh appearance of the Houston Symphony Orchestra will be made on April 4 when the Town Hall season comes to a close. The Symphony with Ernst Hoffman as conductor has always made a hit with the Corps, and this year will be no exception.

Thus, Town Hall under the direction of the Student Activities

office will mark another year of putting forth entertainment that the Corps and service men will enjoy. It is always a pleasure to give this entertainment, and to make it available to as many Aggies and service men as possible, season tickets are available at the special price of \$2. for all performances. 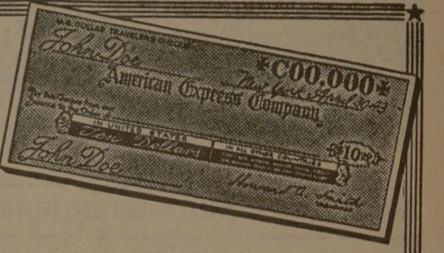
