

Lecturer Will SpeakonPost War Matters

Ex-Prussian Senator To Appear In Guion Hall December 10th

"After Hitler What?" will be the subject of the noted speaker, Max Bauer, a former member of the Prussian Senate, in his lecture to be given in Guion Hall on Friday, December 10, at 7:45 in the evening. Bauer is being brought to the college by the Federal Council of the Churches of Christ in America. His lecture will discuss the post-war reorganization and reconstruction of Germany.

Born in Altona, Germany near Hamburg, Bauer gained prominence at the age of twenty-one as an official of the internationally famous "Production" one of the greatest consumer cooperative movements in Germany. When he was thirty-one, he was elected Mayor of Altona, the youngest man ever to hold that position. His vigorous opposition to the Nazi party witheld his election as mayor of Berlin.

For ten years Bauer was a member of the Prussian Senate, also serving on the government board of the Association of German cities. In January, 1933, the Nazis gained control of the German government, forcing him and his family to flee Germany for Next is an OWI short entitled "Our Enemy, the Japanese."
