A Christmas Thought

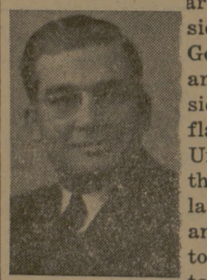

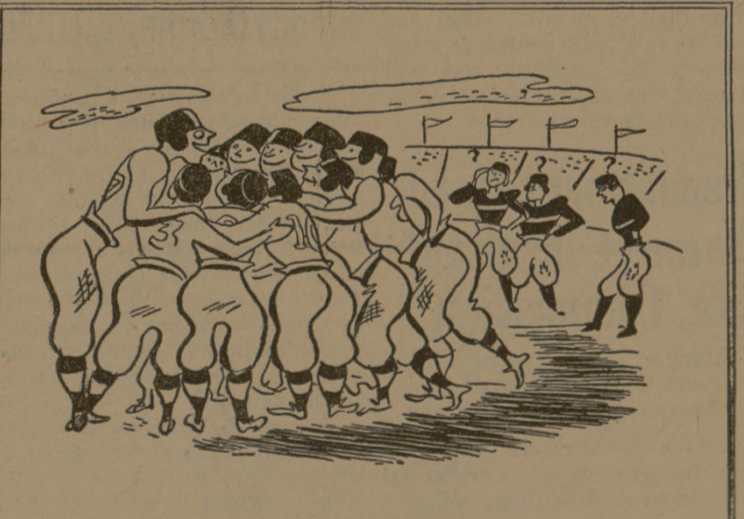
