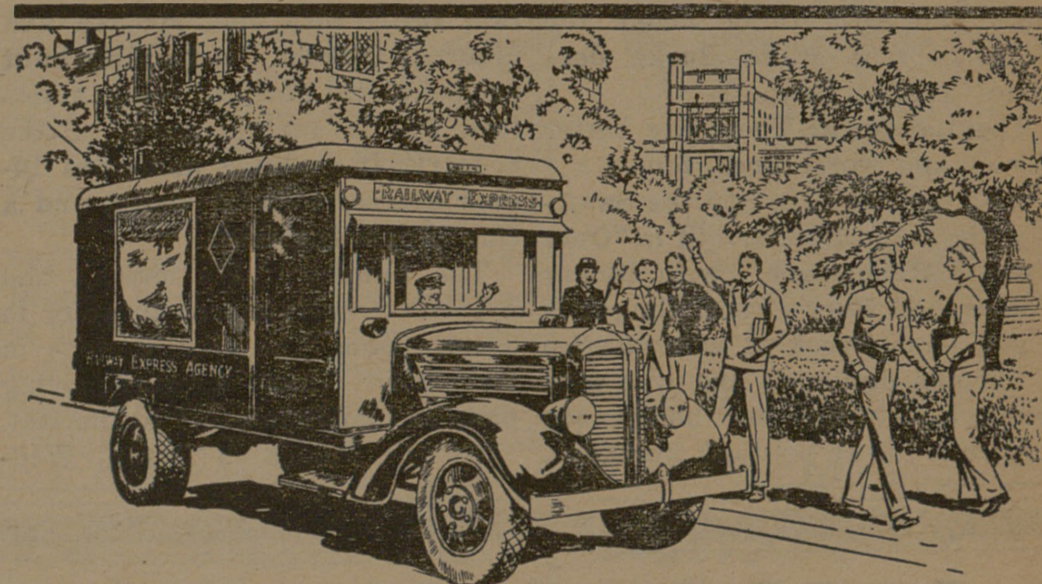
Saturday will be a final semester review.
