Postponement of induction of certain college students in a recent revision in Selective Service Regulations reads as follows:

"Any person who entered upon a course of instruction at a college or university before he became eighteen years of age and who is ordered to report for induction during a quarter or semester of such course of instruction shall, upon his request, have his induction postponed (1) until the end of such quarter or semester (2) until he ceases to pursue continuously and satisfactorily such course of instruction, whichever is the earlier."

Students not on the deficiency or probation list, who otherwise meet the above conditions, should be eligible for postponement of induction until after February 2, 1946. Students called for pre-induction physicals or for induction, who are eligible for postponement, should call at my office, Room 210, Administration Building, promptly.

NOTICE TO DOG OWNERS

The City of College Station and College authorities are making a determined effort to control stray dogs. They are not only a potential source of rabies, but many have become a nuisance in the College Mess Hall and other places.

Notice is hereby given to dog owners that their dogs must be licensed by the City and vaccinated against rabies as set up in Ordinance No. 50 passed on May 23, 1940, and must carry the proper tags showing this has been done. Dogs which become nuisances at the Mess Hall or any other place will be taken up and their owners notified. Unlicensed dogs so taken up will be held for a period of forty-eight hours and then destroyed if unclaimed. Owners are liable and will be held responsible for the cost of taking up the dog and for its care while being held. Such costs will be \$2.50 per animal. Those whose dogs are picked up may call for them at 203 Francis Hall.

SUBJECT—LAUNDRY NOTICE

Laundry Station No. 1 is located next door to the Recreation Hall in the area of the New Dormitories. All student laundry for those living in the Cadet Corps will be turned in and called for at this station. All students will turn in their laundry according to the following schedule:

Students whose last name begins with A, B, C, D should turn in their laundry Friday; E, F, G, H, I should turn in their laundry Monday; J, K, L, M, N, O, P, Q, R, S should turn in their laundry Wednesday; T, U, V, W, X, Y, Z turn in their laundry Thursday.

All laundry must be in before 8:00 A.M. on the designated day. A charge of 15¢ will be made for late or out of place bundles.

Ordinarily the laundry will be ready for return within three to five days from the time it is turned in.

Each student is allowed a 23 piece bundle. This bundle may include 4 shirts, 2 pants, 2 polos, 1 pair coveralls. All extra pieces will be charged according to the following:

Shirts, 10¢; pants, 15¢; polos, 05¢; coveralls, 15¢; small pcs., 02¢.

All claims for lost or damaged articles must be made within 24 hours, and any student making a claim must bring with him his laundry list before any adjustment can be made.
