Postponement of induction of certain college students in a recent revision in Selective Service Regulations reads as follows:
"Any person who entered upon a course of instruction at a college or university before he became eighteen years of age and who is ordered to report for induction during a quarter or semester of such course of instruction shall, upon his request, have his induction postponed (1) until the end of such quarter or semester (2) until he ceases to pursue continuously and satisfactorily such course of instruction, whichever is the earlier.
Students not on the deficiency or probation list, who otherwise meet the above conditions, should be eligible for postponement of induction until after February 2, 1946. Students called for pre-induction physicals or for induction, who are eligible for postponement, should call at my office, Room 210, Administration Building, promptly.

The Texas A. & M. Newman Club had its first meeting for the semester Wednesday, October 10. New officers were elected as follows:

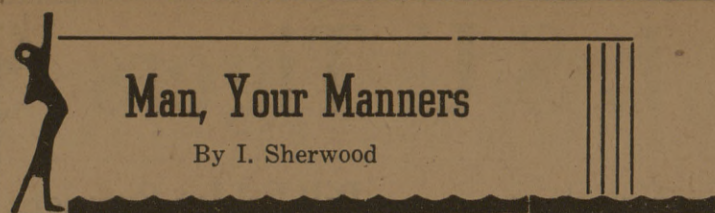
