NICARAGUA... Volcanic Country

By Ruben R. Caro-Costas Nicaragua, largest of the Central American republics, lies midway of Central America bounded on the north by Honduras, on the east by the Caribbean Sea, and on the west and southwest by the Pacific Ocean.

With an approximate area of 51,700 square miles, and a population of almost a million and a half, Nicaragua is traversed by two mountain ranges causing her to have a diversified climate, and a variety of products.

Climate is Diversified There is a diversity of climate due to the mountain ranges that traverse Nicaragua. On the western coast, due to the volcanic nature of the mountains, the climate that predominates is oppressive, yet the largest concentration of population is found here.

Education is Well Developed Education is free and compulsory. Leon, Granada and Managua are the sites of Nicaragua's high seat of learning—the universities and colleges.

Transportation is well developed in the western coast where the majority of the population lives.
