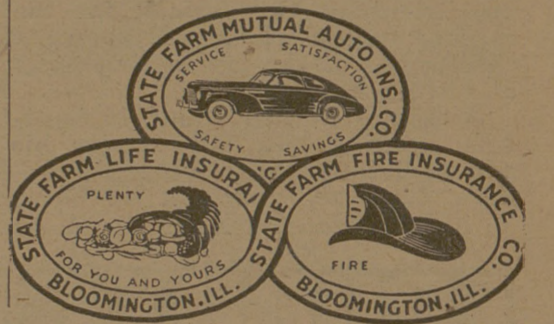
D. A. Adam Returns To Farm Labor Office

Trotter, of the Texas A. and M. College Extension Service. Mr. Adam replaced L. L. Bennett, who returned to his former position as county agricultural agent for Live Oak County.

Formerly emergency farm labor assistant, Mr. Adam was given leave of absence last year to direct activities of the Wage Board. In his new position he is in charge of the migratory farm labor program.

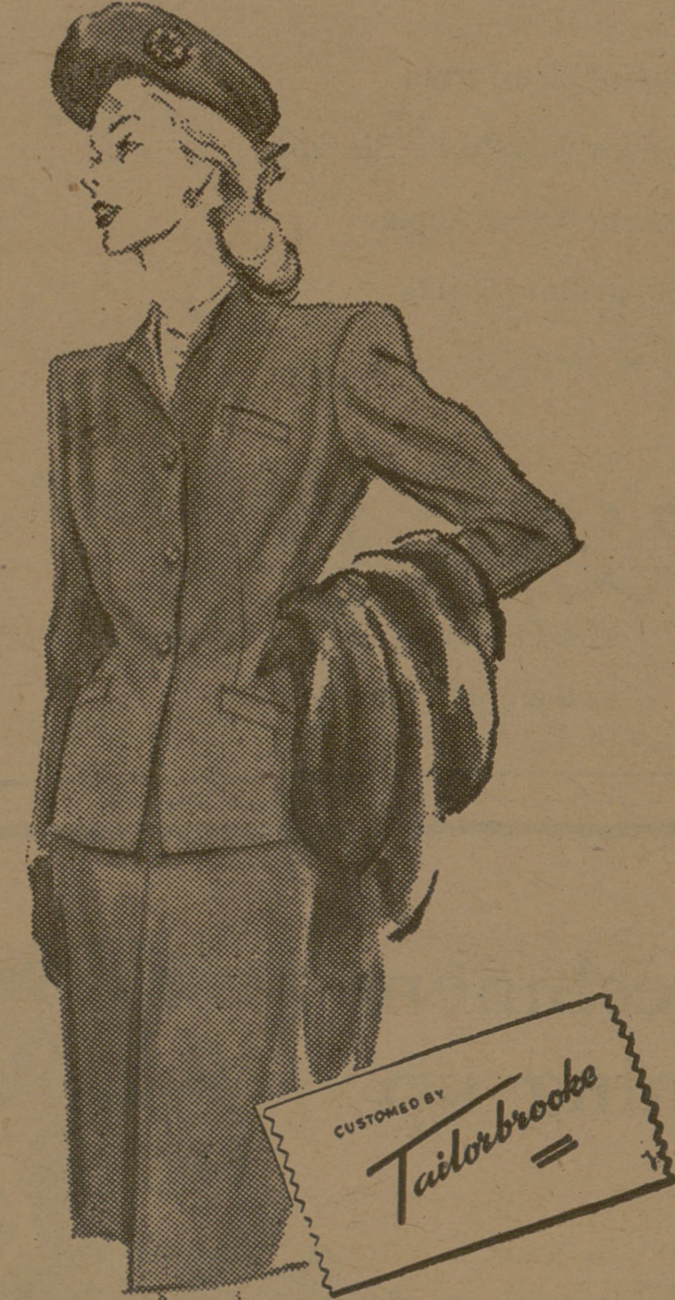
