The social group of the Veteran's Wives club held their weekly bridge tournament Thursday night at 7:15 at Sbisla hall.

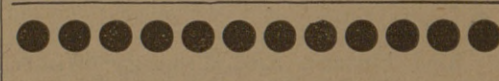

An exceptionally large crowd was present and refreshments were prepared and served by the foods

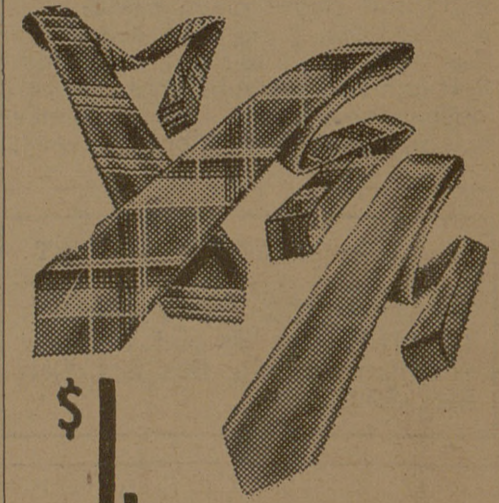
CHILD STUDY GROUP TO MEET WEDNESDAY
