DR. STEEN TO ADDRESS HILLEL CLUB SUNDAY

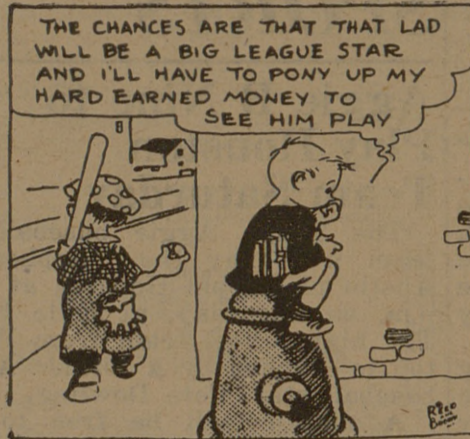
Dr. Ralph Steen of the History Department will address an open Hillel Meeting Sunday April 7 at

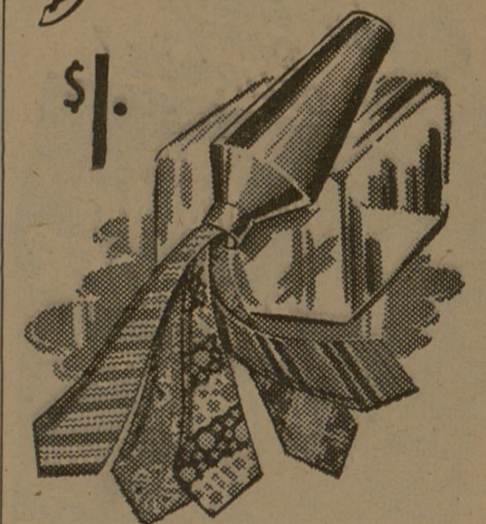

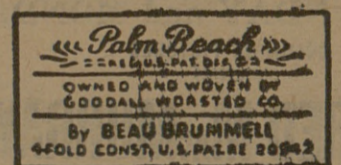
