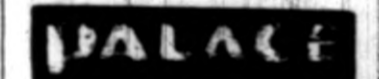

### Senior Swim Course To Start Today

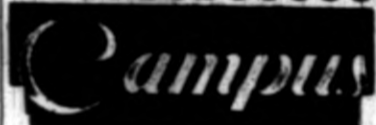
A Senior life saving course will be conducted at Downs Natatorium beginning this evening at 7:30 p. m., according to Texas A. & M. Swimming Coach Art Adamson. Meeting everyday except Saturday and Sunday, the course will continue for 18 periods. All residents of Brazos County who meet the following requirements are eligible to take instruction:

1. Must be seventeen years or older.
2. Must be able to swim 600 yards continuously, of which 200 yards must be side stroke, and 200 yards on the stomach.

The course is set up to meet the specifications of the Red Cross, and is sponsored by the College. Instruction will be furnished by Victor Counts, a member of the Physical Education Department.

### Veterans Now May Reinstate NSLI Within Six Months

There has been a recent change in the requirements to reinstate your National Service Life Insurance. If you have let your National Service Life Insurance lapse, you may now reinstate your insurance within six months after date of discharge, or before January 1, 1947, without a physical examination, providing you are in as good health on the date of application for reinstatement of your insurance as you were when your policy lapsed. Reinstatement is accomplished by executing Veterans Administration Insurance Form No. 353a, and attaching thereto a check or money order for two monthly premium payments. The check or money order should be made payable to the Treasurer of the United States and mailed with Form 353a to Veterans Administration, 846 Broadway, New York 13, N. Y., Attention: Collection Division.
