SAN ANTONIO MOTHERS PLAN CHRISTMAS DANCE

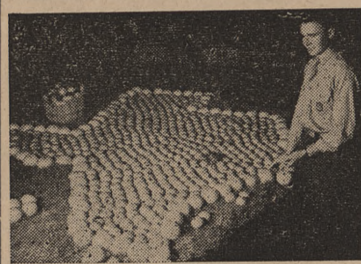

Subject: Room and Board Accommodations for Christmas Holidays
To: All Students

1. In order to conserve utilities and protect student property, all dormitories except Walton, Hart, and Dormitory 14, will be closed and locked at 5:00 P.M., Saturday, December 21, 1946.

2. Students other than those living in Walton, Hart, and Dormitory 14, who wish to remain on the campus during the Christmas holidays will contact students in Dormitory 14 who will not remain during the holidays, concerning the use of their rooms.

To secure rooms, students will bring a note of permission from the occupants of Dormitory 14 to Room 100 Goodwin Hall where each student will sign a roster showing his location for the holidays.

3. If any student finds it necessary to gain entrance to a dormitory which is closed for the holidays he will check at Room 100 Goodwin Hall for clearance.

4. Organization Commanders and Housemasters should urge first floor occupants to lock windows of their respective rooms for security purposes.

5. The dormitories will be unlocked at 1:00 P. M., Wednesday, January 1, 1947.

6. The cafeteria in Siles Hall will be open for students who remain on the campus, beginning Sunday morning, December 22, and will remain open through Wednesday night, January 1, 1947.

Meal costs will be in accordance with prices posted.

Breakfast will not be served unless the number desiring same is large enough to warrant it.
