Crippled Children Benefits Clarified

In an effort to familiarize every person in Texas with the services offered by the Crippled Children's Division of the State Health Department, Dr. George W. Cox, State Health Officer, has released the following statement:

Every crippled child in Texas, under 21 years of age, and of normal mentality whose parents are unable to pay for needed care, is entitled to assistance from this Division.

Assistance may be obtained by applying to the Crippled Children's Division, Texas State Department of Health, Austin, or by placing an application through an established city or county health unit. Full information about local groups and organizations throughout the state who are anxious to assist crippled children to establish their eligibility and receive proper care, may be had by writing for a pamphlet, "Handbook on Agencies." Bryan Allocated Three State National Guard Units of 49th Armored Division

Three Texas National Guard units have been allocated to Bryan, as follows: Headquarters and Headquarters Company, Company C, and Medical Detachment of 386th Armored Engineer Battalion. This battalion is part of the 49th Armored Division, one of two National Guard Armored Divisions in the United States.

Captain T. G. Campbell is to head Company C, and Captain F. A. (Bud) Clark will command Headquarters and Headquarters Company. They open the enlistments on Wednesday, February 19, 7:30 p. m., at the Chamber of Commerce, Bryan.

Special information regarding National Guard is important to men who at present are on the G. I. program in any way. The Adjutant General, State of Texas, has interpreted current rulings to mean that pay for drill in the National Guard may be received by ex-service men without jeopardizing or affecting their receiving the maximum allowance of subsistence pay or on the job training under the G. I. Bill of Rights.

Furthermore, all personnel who are in the organized Reserves can resign from the Reserves and enlist in the National Guard without preventing a return to the Reserves later if desired. It is possible for a man to advance in the Guards' and, should he obtain a higher rank, he may keep that rank in the event of an emergency. The weekly drill pay figures are as follows: private, \$2.50; pri-

vate first class, \$2.66; corporal, \$3.00; sergeant, \$3.33; staff sergeant, \$3.83; technical sergeant, \$4.50; master sergeant and first sergeant, \$5.50; 2nd lieutenant, \$6.00; 1st lieutenant, \$6.66; captain, \$7.66; major, \$9.16; lt. colonel, \$10.69; and colonel, \$12.22.

The guardsman will receive this pay for 50 weeks, and in addition will receive full-time pay for attendance at two week summer camp.

Champion Steer On Exhibit Feb. 23-25

Royal Jupiter, international grand champion steers, which is being sent on a 22,000 mile education tour by the Firestone Tire and Rubber Company, will be on free exhibition in the A. H. Pavilion February 23 through 25.

The \$14,490 Shorthorn was crowned "King Shroloin 1947" and several pages on the steer appeared in the January 27 edition of Life Magazine. He is being exhibited in leading cattle growing communities in every section of the country.

Memorandum No. 45 February 14, 1947
Subject: Dance Accommodations for Ladies To: All Students

1. In compliance with the request of the Committee in charge, and with the approval of the organization commanders concerned, Dormitory 2 will be used to provide accommodations for visiting girls attending the Freshman and George Washington Balls, FRIDAY and SATURDAY nights, February 21 & 22, 1947.

2. Students having guests will be assessed a charge of \$7.75 per night per guest to cover cost of matron, maid service, and other incidental expenses. Refunds cannot be made.

3. Guests staying in the dormitory must be in not later than 2:00 A. M. FRIDAY night and 1:00 A. M. SATURDAY night. Guests must check in with the matron upon their return to the dormitory after the dances. When reservations have been made for the guests, they will not be permitted to check out until departure for their homes. This will be done with the matron. Escorts will be held strictly accountable for compliance with these instructions.

4. Cadets living in Dormitory 2 must vacate their rooms by 1:00 P. M. FRIDAY, 21 February 1947.

5. From 1:00 to 3:00 P. M. students having guests will prepare the rooms for reception of guests. Students will furnish linens, towels, etc. Escorts will be held responsible for all equipment and supplies in rooms.

6. Guests will be admitted to their rooms at 4:00 P. M. FRIDAY 21 February 1947, and must be vacated by 11:30 A. M. SUNDAY. Luggage will be removed from the rooms and the doors locked promptly at 11:30 A. M. The College cannot be responsible for personal property of any guest or student.

7. Room assignments may be made by students living in Dormitory 2 who wish to reserve own room at 8:00 A. M. MONDAY 17 February 1947. Beginning at 8:00 A. M. Tuesday 18 February other students having guest for the Freshman Ball may sign for their guests. Students can secure these assignments in the PLACEMENT OFFICE, Room 126, Administration Building.

8. P. G. Hall will be used for the weekend under the same provisions and instructions above, except the charge is \$1.00 per night per guest and the linens etc. will be furnished by the college.

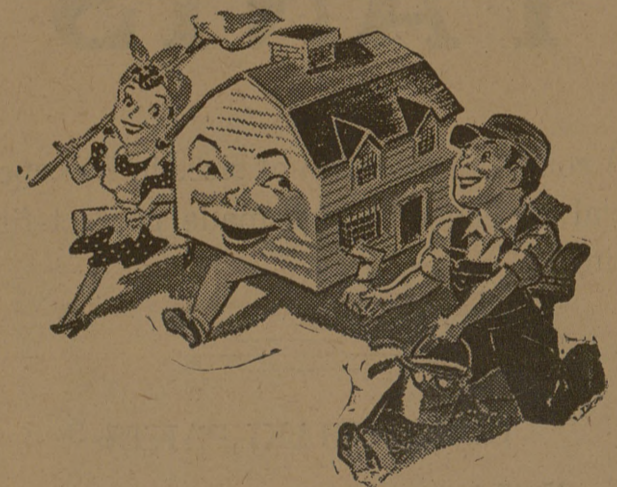

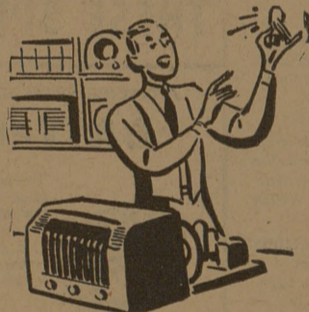
