the motor and construction of a special 2,300-volt power transmission line to be completed before the \$100,000 plant is ready for op-

Engineering specifications now are being drawn up for the motor mounting and power line construction, and bids from contractors will be called for soon.

Pinkerton said a B-32 four bladed propeller, 13 feet in diameter had been obtained from war surplus for the fan unit.

The wind tunnel, 90 feet long with a test chamber 7 feet high and 10 feet wide, will be able to handle the wing performance and engine-cooling tests, while the building of which the tunnel is a part will house the structural and engine testing laboratories.






