Air Conditioning Conference in June

The Third Annual Air Conditioning Conference to be held during June 8, 9, 10, and 11, is open to anyone interested in any phase of air conditioning, the Mechanical Engineering Department announced.

An Executive Committee headed by Reg F. Taylor, Consulting Engineer, Houston, Texas, with Bert P. Fisher, Southern Furnace and Supply Co., Houston, and Professor Wayne E. Long, Mechanical Engineering Department as co-chairmen, have drawn up a tentative program.

During the summers of 1939 and 1940 the conferences were held under the name of the Annual Air Conditioning Short Course, but with the continuation of the work after the war the name has been changed to clarify the meaning of the meeting. It is not intended that any attempt will be made to teach the fundamentals of air conditioning but rather that common problems and new ideas be exchanged.

Complete information relative to the program will be published when final arrangements are completed. Further details of the conference may be obtained from the chairman, it was stated.

Model Plane Meet Planned

A. & M. will stage its annual control-line model airplane contest here on June 22, Roger L. Barton, meet director, announced. There will be control-line events in Classes A, B, C, and D, Barton said, in addition to stunt events for both youngsters and adults. The show will be held at the Kyle Field baseball diamond, where spectators may sit in the stands. The usual prize list will be posted, but there will be no admission charge.

Barton announced that the meet, sanctioned by the Academy of Model Aeronautics, has been cleared by the Southwestern Gas Model association, and will conflict in date with no other meets.

An earlier contest, limited to enthusiasts in the College Station-Bryan community area, will be held here May 11 in conjunction with Mother's Day festivities, Barton said.

The May 11 show will also culminate a three-day short course for American Legionnaires from Districts 6 and 7, who will learn how to encourage and direct model-airplane activities in their respective communities.

The Legionnaires will run the May 11 show, under supervision, Barton said.
