Rev. Arthur Smith To Conduct Baptist Bible Study Groups



The Rev. Arthur M. Smith has been named full-time teacher of the Baptist Chair of Bible at A. & M. beginning with the summer sessions, the Rev. R. L. Brown stated Tuesday. Instituted several months ago, the instruction has been carried on by the Rev. Brown, pastor of the College Station Baptist Church.

Two courses will be offered this summer under Rev. Smith, surveys in the Old and New Testaments. Both will be taught in the First Baptist Church.

Rev. Smith holds B. S. and M. S. degrees in Education from Southern Illinois Normal University at Carbondale, Illinois. He also spent two years at Moody Bible Institute, two years at Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, Kentucky, and one year at Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary at Fort Worth, receiving a Master of Theology degree at the latter school in 1946.

His wife and three sons will join him soon in College Station.

Edmonds to Speak To 'Star Gazers'

On Monday, June 16, the A. & M. Astronomical Society will hold its first meeting of the summer in Room 39, Physics Building at 7:30 p.m. A. G. Edmonds will speak on "Photographic Processing as Related to Astronomy."

Under the direction of E. E. Vezey, the organization proposes to construct an observatory to house a 24-inch reflecting telescope. The latter is also to be built to replace Vezey's 12-inch telescope, currently used.

President Vincent O'Bryan encourages all persons interested in any phase of astronomy to attend this meeting.

Beutel, Thomas New Trustees In Research Foundation Body

A. P. Beutel of Freeport and J. B. Thomas, Ft. Worth were elected trustees of the College Research Foundation Tuesday at the third annual meeting of the Councilors of the Foundation. Three other trustees, H. W. Barlow, dean of engineering of the college, Victor Schoffelmeyer, Dallas, and E. L. Kurth, of Lufkin, were reelected to the governing body.

Beutel, a division manager for Dow Chemical Company, replaces J. W. Carpenter, Dallas, as a trustee from the industrial group and Thomas takes the place of W. B. Cook of Houston in the alumni group. Barlow is a representative of the college; Schoffelmeyer, agriculture editor of the Dallas Morning News, is the agriculture trustee; and Kurth, a lumberman, is from the public group.

The term of office for these positions is three years. The trusteeships are divided in a manner which enables each of five groups to be represented by three trustees. The three men from each group serve in staggered terms. The annual election is held by a mail vote of the councilors and announced at the meeting. In addition to the election results, the councilors reviewed the

work of the organization in the past year. The function of the Foundation is to provide research facilities for the industrial and agricultural groups of the state. It was recommended to the board of trustees that funds be

raised by the issuance of debentures and that the by-laws be changed to permit the appointment of more than 50 councilors as is the current rule.

The councilors heard progress reports from project directors on ten research activities now in operation.

Judge Edward S. Boyles of Houston, a recent speaker at the commencement program, visited the session.
