## Methodist Youths Scheduled to Meet Here June 23-28

June 23-28 the Texas Conference Methodist Youth Fellowship will hold its annual assembly on the campus.

Approximately 500 Methodist youths will convene for a week of study, worship, and recreation, with accredited instructors leading discussions of interest to the various age groups. The entire program is planned to help strengthen Youth Fellowship in the local church.

Dr. Paul Quillian, pastor of First Methodist Church, Houston, has been chosen for the morning guest speaker, and Emmert Dubberly of Brenham will serve as dean of men, and Mrs. Fisher as dean of women.

Helen Hall, First Methodist Church, Houston, is president of the Texas Conference Methodist Youth Fellowship. She has led the youth council in making plans for the assembly and will preside at the business sessions during the week.

## Waldrop Changing Location in Bryan

A. M. Waldrop and Company in Bryan is to have a new home.

Complete remodeling has been started on the building formerly occupied by A&P. The new building will provide 1,300 square feet or more of floor space than the present location.

The new store, to have modern fixtures and recessed front windows, will occupy two floors and will be air conditioned. Latest types of lighting equipment will add to the ease and comfort of shopping.

The first floor will include the ladies' department, the boys' department, and men's furnishings. It will also include luggage, hat, and shoe departments.

## Forestry Course Finishes Thursday

The practical forestry course for county agents conducted at the Stecke State Forest ended yesterday, and plans are being made to extend the course to include vocational agriculture teachers next summer. S. L. Frost, chief of the Division of Education of the Texas Forest Service, has announced.

This year's course, conducted by the Texas Forest Service in cooperation with the Extension Service and the Range Forestry Department, lasted three weeks and was attended by 13 county agents. The course was taught by Dr. V. A. Young and Bob Rhodes of the Range Management Department and C. W. Simmons, Extension Service forester.

Instruction given on the field covered such subjects as timber surveys, cutting plans, tree growth, soils and their effect on tree survival, marketing and selling problems, and special training in extension methods.

According to Frost, the course was financed by the Texas Forest Service Association, Texas Lumber Manufacturing Association, Kirby Lumber Corporation, Southland Paper and Fiber Company, and Heide H. Thompson, retired lumberman.

## Camera Club Will Organize Monday

The A. & M. Camera Club will be reorganized at a meeting Monday in the Physics Building at 7:30 p.m. according to Claude Stone, acting president. All students interested in photography are invited to attend, Stone stated. The new club will probably be on a broader basis than previously, with both advanced and elementary groups, the latter being for those who "push the button and let the drug store do the rest."
