

Applications Open In Three Positions By Civil Service

Examinations have been announced by the U. S. Civil Service Commission for filling Engineer, Accountant, and Auditor positions in the Federal service.

The Engineering positions, which range in salary from \$3,397 to \$9,675 a year, are located in the Army Air Force, War Department, at Dayton and Wilmington, Ohio. To qualify applicants must have completed a professional engineering curriculum in a college or university, or they must have had 4 years of technical engineering experience or appropriate education and experience combined. In addition, they must have had from 1 to 4 years of responsible professional engineering experience. Graduate study may be substituted for a part of the required experience.

Accountant and Auditor examinations are located in Washington, D. C., and nearby Virginia and Maryland. The salaries range from \$3,397 to \$9,905 a year. Competitors for these positions must have had accounting experience of a responsible nature, part of which must be in a specialized field of accounting. A written test will not be given.

Applications for Engineer positions may be filed until further notice and should be sent to the Executive Secretary, Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, Headquarters, Air Materiel Command, Wright Field (Area A-XCB), Dayton, Ohio. Accountant and Auditor applications must be received in the Commission's Washington office not later than August 12.

Civilian Personnel Sought For Posts In Overseas Areas

Men needed for civilian positions overseas in connection with the program for return and final burial of World War II dead are being recruited in this area, it was announced today by Colonel Braxton G. Butler, Acting Commanding Officer of the Fort Worth Quartermaster Depot.

A wide range of employment is being offered to qualified personnel who wish to take part in this program as members of one of the fourteen Field Operating Sections of the American Graves Registration Service which will tour the entire Pacific, Far Eastern, and India-Burma areas. The Field Operating Sections will be organized and outfitted at Honolulu, Hawaii.

Among the positions now open and yearly salaries paid are: administrative assistant, \$5187; licensed embalmers, \$4246.50 and \$3306; property and supply clerk, \$2992.50 and \$2710.35; medical technicians (chemistry), \$2992.50 and \$2710.35; medical technicians (roentgenology), \$2992.50 and \$2710.35; photographer, \$2710.35; guards, \$2523; storekeepers, \$2992.50 and \$2710.35; motor vehicle dispatcher, \$2525; nurses aide, \$2992.50; guard (convoyer), \$2804.40; reports and records clerk, \$2992.50; clerk typist, \$2710.35.

In addition, mess managers, cooks, second cooks, and assistant cooks are needed. Pay for these positions range from \$95 to \$145 an hour.

Those who qualify for these positions will be entitled to certain privileges accorded civil service employees, including vacation and sick leave. In addition, hospitalization and treatment of civilian personnel will be provided at a minimum cost in areas where Army dispensaries are available.

Dr. Young, Sperry Conduct Course For County Agents

Dr. Vernon A. Young and Omer E. Sperry, both of the Range and Forestry Department at A. & M., recently conducted a course for more than two dozen West Texas county agricultural agents in Pecos County. The course in Management and Range problems was introduced for the first time by the Extension service in cooperation with the Range and Forestry Department.

The group visited some of the leading ranches in Pecos county, putting to practical use some of the theory they had learned in class. The agents also compared the various range management practices as they are being applied by leading sheep and cattle ranchmen. Some of the ranches visited were those of L. T. Clark, Clayton Puckett, and the famous EL Ranch.

Dr. Young stated that the purpose of the course was to train county agents in better range management practices that can be applied successfully by ranchmen in their respective counties.
