Next Chem Congress Set for US in 1951

The Twelfth International Congress of Pure and Applied Chemistry will be held in the United States in 1951, it was announced at the close of the eleventh Congress in London, first to be held since the war.

Dr. W. Albert Noyes, Jr., president of the American Chemical Society, said the 1951 meeting would probably be held in New York City.

A patent has been issued G. L. Farrar, assistant professor of chemical engineering, for a process used in volume production of aviation gasoline.

The process, described as isomerization of normal butane to isomerization of normal butane to isomerization, was developed during the war when Farrar did research work for the Magnolia Petroleum company in its Dallas laboratories. It compares favorably, from an economic standpoint, with the widely-used Shell process, according to Farrar.

The patent has been assigned to the Socony-Vacuum Corporation, which Farrar left last February to accept his appointment here.
