

The farm labor program of the A. & M. Extension Service will continue in full force until the end of the year, Caesar "Dutch" Hohn, state supervisor of the program, has an-

The program has been operated by the Extension Service under Congressional authorization since 1943 when the acute farm labor shortage demanded emergency action, but will revert to the Texas Employment Commission on January 1, 1948, Hohn explained.
