Record Enrollment Expected in Fall

A record enrollment of nearly 100,000 World War II veterans in Southwestern colleges and universities this fall is anticipated by the Veterans Administration and educators.

Veterans Administration officials expect about a 15 per cent increase in the number of veterans attending college under the GI Bill as compared to last spring's enrollment of 85,000 in the higher institutions of learning in Texas, Louisiana, and Mississippi.

Veterans entering school for the first time should obtain their certificates of eligibility immediately from the proper VA regional office. Others who plan to change schools or courses of study this fall must obtain prior approval from the Veterans Administration.

Veterans enrolled in school prior to this fall may continue their education without contacting the Veterans Administration.

Farm Labor Program Will Continue ... Hohn

The farm labor program of the A. & M. Extension Service will continue in full force until the end of the year, Caesar "Dutch" Hohn, state supervisor of the program, has announced.

The program has been operated by the Extension Service under Congressional authorization since 1943 when the acute farm labor shortage demanded emergency action, but will revert to the Texas Employment Commission on January 1, 1948, Hohn explained.

Texas Businesses Sent 4-H Invites

The A. & M. Extension Service extended invitations this week to all commercial concerns in Texas to set up exhibits of their products at the annual Extension agent's conference and State 4-H Club Round-Up, September 2-5, at College Station.

The five-day conference and 4-H Round-Up will be attended by all county agricultural and home demonstration agents in Texas. Four 4-H Club members and two adult club leaders are expected to come in from every Texas county for the Round-Up.

The Extension Service, sponsoring the event, advises commercial concerns wishing to put up exhibits to contact the Extension specialist at College Station whose field of work is closest related to the type of exhibit to be set up.

It is a book in which many stories are woven. There is the story of the love between Lyman and the woman he cannot marry, whose letters in his pocket seem to him like hidden laughter as he goes his sober way to the quarry office or writes down the town records. There is the compassionate story of Lyman's life with his wife, Louise, in the house on Main St. Most deeply meaningful is the story of Lyman's sincere and enduring friendship with Easy, the runaway slave, whose life was closely knitted with his from the days in a narrow valley of Vermont, but their lives have warm touch with the world outside, with

the new Wild West of the gold camps, the South of Reconstruction days, with Providence and Newport and Paris.
