**United Nations.**

An organization to be composed solely of students, the NSO disclaims any political or religious objectives and announces the intent to concern itself only with those objects which directly affect students.

Seven hundred student delegates representing an estimated 800,000 students of 300 colleges in 43 states composed the national group in a meeting last winter at the University of Chicago. The national organization aims at affiliating not only the student bodies of American colleges but also the various national student organizations such as the YM-YWCA, the American Unitarian Youth, the Hillside Foundation, and the National Federation of Catholic College Students.

**Cullinan**, Dorm 2 housemaster and veteran, was present at the first meeting last December as an observer. At the regional convention in April, he was chosen vice-president of the regional organization. He will be a member of the A. & M. delegation.

**Buntyn**, a married veteran student assistant of the college Department of Information and Publicity and member of the Student Council, is another national delegate.

The third man in the A. & M. delegation is **Leatherwood**. He was president of last year's Junior Class, and a member of the Cadet Corps; he was recently given the rank of major as commander of the Artillery Battalion.
