Infantry Team Takes High Honors In National ROTC

The ROTC Infantry team from A&M took third place honors in the Warrior of the Pacific Competition, it was announced yesterday by Colonel G. S. Meloy, Jr., PMST.

An August 29 release from the War Department, sponsor of the competition, gave West Virginia University first place honors, which entitled them to the bronze statuette now in possession of the University of Hawaii, and second place to the University of Wisconsin.

The award is made annually to the Infantry team making the highest average score in the ROTC summer camps. An average score of 173.3 was made by each man on the A&M team.

Colonel Meloy added that a letter of commendation was recently received from Brigadier General Lewis C. Beebe, Chief of Staff, Fourth Army, which read, "The Army Commander has noted the commendable record achieved in this Warrior of the Pacific Competition and extends his congratulations to each of the members of the A&M College team."

Exams Slated With State Department

Competitive examinations for positions in local units affiliated with the State Department of Health have just been announced by the Merit System Council for the Texas State Department of Health.

Examinations are for public health medical positions, and will consist of an evaluation of training and experience and an oral examination. Veterans preference will be allowed applicants who have been honorably discharged from the United States armed forces, and who make a passing score on the examination.

Applications will be received continuously until further notice. Positions for which examinations will be held are: directors of local health units; directors of communicable disease control in various specialties; and public health physicians. Salaries range from \$5,508 to \$7,200, according to the size of the unit and to the qualifications of the individual applicants.
