Secretary of Agriculture Anderson disclosed after a special cabinet meeting yesterday that Mr. Truman not only would make public today the report prepared by his cabinet committee on food but would accompany it with a statement of his own views.

The cabinet committee earlier this week submitted recommendations which were said to call for a voluntary rationing program at home and a ceiling on grain exports to ease the pressure on domestic prices.


