News Headquarters Across From Kyle Field Established

Located across from the Athletic Office is the new Press Headquarters, to be used for offices of the athletic coaches and as a place to hold conferences.

The coaches who will be located in this building include Harry Stiteler, Frank G. Anderson, Marty Karow, W. N. "Uncle Bill" James, Charlie DeWare, Botchy Koch, Johnnie Frankie, Wayne Cure, W. R. Steymann, and Tom Pickett.

On week-ends when A&M is host at sports events here, this building will be used as a press headquarters for all press reporters, newsmen, sportswriters, and sports radio broadcasters, stated P. L. Downs, Jr., athletic job manager. Typewriters and desks will be available for early file or color stories. Iced soft drinks, coffee, and sandwiches will be furnished pressbox officials during all home football games by this office. Downs will also have an office in this building.

Sports writers and pressbox officials can pick up their passes at the Press Headquarters, and use it as a place to contact other newsmen.

Offices of the Director of Athletics W. R. "Bill" Carmichael, Head Football Coach Homer Norton, and Business Manager C. D. Ownby will remain in the Athletic Office where they have previously been located.

"This will not be an information bureau, but a place parents of athletes now in school can be assisted in locating their sons," said Downs. "It will be our policy to promote goodwill and fellowship for all visitors to the Athletic Department."

Press headquarters will be moved to the new offices now being constructed under the stadium as soon as they are completed.

Expect Truman Report on Food

WASHINGTON, Sept. 25 (AP)—President Truman readied a food report for an anxious world today as a preliminary step to discussing foreign help measures with Republican and Democratic congressional leaders next Monday.

The chief executive invited reporters to the White House today for his first news conference since his departure for Brazil late last month.

Secretary of Agriculture Anderson disclosed after a special cabinet meeting yesterday that Mr. Truman not only would make public today the report prepared by his cabinet committee on food but would accompany it with a statement of his own views.

The cabinet committee earlier this week submitted recommendations which were said to call for a voluntary rationing program at once and a ceiling on grain exports to ease the pressure on domestic prices.
