## President of ASC To Address Group Thursday Night

Dr. W. Albert Naves Jr., national president of the American Chemical Society, will speak on "Fluorescence and Photochemistry" Thursday evening at 8 in the Chemistry Lecture Room. The announcement was made by Fred W. Jensen, secretary of the A&M Section of the ACS and head of the Department of Chemistry. Dr. Naves, who is chairman of the Department of Chemistry at the University of Rochester, is editor of "Chemical Reviews," and is past editor of the "Chemical Bulletin." He was educated at Grinnell College and the University of Paris. Since his graduation from the latter school he has taught at the University of California, the University of Chicago, Brown University, and the University of Rochester. The public is invited to hear Dr. Naves' address. At 8:30 Thursday evening a dinner will be held in honor of the distinguished chemist at Aggeland Inn for local section members and their wives. Following the meeting the group will gather at the home of Dr. and Mrs. W. M. Potts, 210 Lee Street, South Oakwood.
