Sealed Proposals, addressed to Ernest Langford, Mayor of the City of College Station, Texas, for the construction of a combined city office and warehouse for said City, will be received at the City Hall, College Station, Texas, until 4:00 o'clock, P. M., on the 31st day of October, 1947, and then publicly opened and read. Bids must be plainly marked "Bids for Construction of Combined City Office and Warehouse for the City of College Station."
The successful bidder will be required to enter into a contract with the City Council and the City of College Station, Texas; however, the City Council reserves the right to reject any and all bids, cash bids or certified checks, issued by a Texas Bank, payable without recourse to the order of Ernest Langford, Mayor of the City of College Station, Texas, in an amount not less than five (5%) per cent of the largest possible total bid, including consideration of alternates, most advantageous to the City of College Station. If awarded the contract, the bidder will promptly enter into contract and execute bonds, as outlined in the specifications and instructions to bidders.
A performance bond, in an amount of One Hundred (100%) per cent of the contract price will be required.
Attention is called to the fact that not less than the minimum wage rates prevailing in the locality in which the work is performed for work of a similar character, and not less than the general prevailing rate of per diem wages of legal holidays and overtime work, shall be paid to all laborers, workmen and mechanics employed in the construction of public works, and the following is the general prevailing rate in the City of College Station, Brazos County, Texas:

The contract price will be paid the City in interest bearing time warrants, and the City Council will on or after the 31st day of October, 1947, pass an ordinance authorizing the issuance of Warrants in the maximum amount of \$21,000.00 bearing interest at a rate not to exceed three (3%) per cent per annum, and maturing serially over a period not exceeding fifteen (15) years from their date.
