## A-M Judging Team Places Sixth At Kansas City Livestock Show

The A&M livestock judging team placed sixth at the American Royal Livestock Show at Kansas City Oct. 18-21. The team consisted of the following members: Claude Broom, Riley Kothmann, J. E. Eckert, Glen Richardson, M. M. Kothmann and Oliver Grote, alternate. Bill Warren and A. C. Sears, coaches, accompanied the group.

Seventeen teams participated in the judging contest. Only two Texas schools, A&M and Texas Tech, were represented at Kansas City.

The colleges placing in the top six were Iowa State College, Kansas State College, University of Wisconsin, University of Missouri, Nebraska State College and A&M. Twelve classes of livestock were judged and eight classes were talked (stated reasons) by the A&M team.

The A&M judging team placed fourth in judging horses and mules, eighth in judging cattle and third in judging sheep.

Riley K. Kothmann placed sixth individually, and placed second in the judging of sheep. M. M. Kothmann placed fifth in the judging of horses.

Preparations are now being made for the International Royal Livestock Show in Chicago, November 27, according to Warren.
