Dr. Kyle M. Yates, pastor of the Second Baptist Church in Houston, will speak at a general religious meeting in Guion Hall Monday evening from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

A well known lecturer, scholar, teacher, and pastor, Dr. Yates was educated at Wake Forest Southern Baptist Theological Seminary and the University of Edinburgh in Scotland. He taught at Southern Seminary for twenty years before coming to Houston as a pastor. While at the Seminary he wrote several books on the Old Testament as well as conducting many revivals and religious rallies.

Dick Baker, from Baylor University, will lead the group singing. Baker has led the singing in several of the City-wide Youth Revivals.

Students and local residents of all denominations are invited to attend this mass religious meeting, sponsored by the Baptist Student Union.
