### National Council Member of AAUP Speaks Thursday

Professor George E. Potter, national council member representing District IX of the American Association of University Professors, will address the local chapter, Thursday evening at 8 in the YMCA Assembly Room, John J. Sperry, secretary-treasurer, announced yesterday.

Dr. Potter's subject will be "Some of the Problems of the Central Office of the National Organization," Sperry stated. He will include in his talk the effects of President Truman's Loyalty Order as discussed before the National Council, problems and complaints of university faculties, and the demand on the part of UNESCO that AAUP take a leading role in the rehabilitation of devastated educational systems.

According to Sperry, Dr. Potter will discuss the pressing problem that the National AAUP equip itself more adequately as a counseling agent for college administrative officers in regard to their faculty problems.

All members of the staff of A. & M. and Allen Academy are invited to attend, Sperry concluded.

### 2, 4-D Discussed At Agronomy Meet

Dr. A. A. Dunlap, head of the department of plant physiology and plant pathology, discussed the effects of 2, 4-D dust on the cotton industry in the Coastal Area of Texas at the Agronomy meeting Tuesday evening.

Slides were shown which indicated the damages done to the cotton fields which were in the same vicinity of rice that was being dusted with 2, 4-D for weed control. Some cotton fields as far as five to twelve miles from the dusted rice fields showed the effects of the dust. It is estimated that in the two counties of Matagorda and Wharton alone there were 2,000 acres of cotton damaged resulting in approximately a \$200,000 loss.

At the meeting it was voted to send George Kunze and one member of the Crops Judging Team as delegates to the Chicago National Convention of the student section of the Agronomy Society.

The A&M Collegiate Future Farmer Chapter entertained members and their wives Monday. A film entitled "The River" was shown. The film which was centered around the Mississippi River, showed the benefits and the cost of the river to America.
