Authority for the statement was Dr. Rhea H. Williams, health coordinator of North Texas Agri-

cultural College. Dr. Williams said only 63 per stated. cent of Texas colleges have health departments. During the 1946-47 school year, Texas colleges spent an average of \$4,58 per student for health service compared with the national average of \$7.98, he said. 
