Tractor Presented To Ag Engineers

The John Deere Plow Company of Dallas recently presented the Agricultural Engineering Department a John Deere Model A 1945 row crop type cut-away tractor.

The tractor is completely sectioned to show the working parts, and will be used for classroom instructional purposes. An electric motor operates the two-cylinder engine and the final drive gears at a slow speed in order for observers to see all of the moving parts.

Forestry Service Benefits by New Directors Ruling

The board of directors, who supervise the activities of the Texas Forest Service, have made it easier for the smaller timberland owners to avail themselves of personal on-the-ground service to assist them in producing and marketing increased supplies of forest products continuously.

The board has authorized president Gibb Gilchrist to accept funds from counties, towns, corporations, groups, or individuals for use of the Texas Forest Service in employing management foresters who would give the above service to smaller timberland owners.

The Texas Forest Service at present employs two project foresters who are partly financed with funds from the federal government. While their services are in such demand that they can't keep up with requests, present state and federal budgets will not permit the hiring of additional qualified men. Thus the board action clears the way for acceptance of private funds to permit the hiring of more management foresters on a cooperative basis.

The board also has approved an additional gift of \$500 from W. Goodrich Jones of Waco for use in further developing a recreational area at the state forest bearing his name near Conroe in Montgomery County. Jones previously gave \$1,000 toward this project, and a lake has already been made.

Other action by the board included the acceptance of an airplane and aerial camera from the Civil Air Patrol, Texas Forest Patrol unit for use in Texas Forest Service protection work.

PENN STATE VOTED LAMBERT TROPHY

NEW YORK, Dec. 5 —(AP)—The Lambert Memorial Trophy symbolizing eastern football supremacy goes this year to unblemished Penn State.

The Nittany Lions, who ran through a nine-game schedule without mishap and accepted a bid to play SMU in the Cotton Bowl, received 68 of the 108 votes cast by football writers and broadcasters.

Second in the poll was Pennsylvania with 17 and then followed Army, 14; Columbia, 6, and Rutgers, 3.

Interracial Meet To Be Held Sunday At Prairie View

An interracial meeting will be held by the Presbyterian Young People's League of College Station and the Christian students at Prairie View College, Sunday afternoon at 3 according to Rev. Norman Anderson, Presbyterian minister.

"The purpose of the meeting is to develop better racial understanding between the two groups," says Rev. Anderson. "The church's responsibility is to pioneer better understanding between races and among those of other religious faiths. We plan on holding this meeting annually." The plan was adopted after Rev. Anderson spoke in the Sunday morning service at Prairie View on Faith Sunday.

The topic to be discussed at this first meeting is "Europe's Economy and America's Responsibility." It will be conducted in the form of a panel discussion with George Jones acting as the chairman and Paul Wilhelm, Jerry Carpenter, Dick Adams, and Madame Russell C. Neff serving as members. After the group has discussed the subject, the audience will participate in a general discussion of the topic.

Those who are going to Prairie View will meet at the YMCA at 1:15 p.m. Sunday and leave by private automobiles. "Everyone caring to attend the meeting is welcome to go," Rev. Anderson concluded.

Fat Stock Show Will Be Held In Ft. Worth Jan. 30

Get your date book out and circle January 30 through February 8 because big things will be happening at the 1948 Southwestern Exposition and Fat Stock Show at Fort Worth.

A large number of Bryan and College Station personalities will officiate at the show. Department superintendent of herefords will be B. J. Baskin of Bryan, employed with the Tennessee Coal, Iron, and Railroad Company. The department superintendent of Dairy Cattle and Boys Dairy Calf Show will be A. L. Darnell, dairy husbandry professor.

Department superintendent of Sheep and the Boys' Lamb Show will be J. M. Jones, animal husbandry department. G. W. Barnes, Texas Extension Service, College Station, is department superintendent of Fat Steers-Open Classes and Boys Baby Beef Show. F. I. Dahlberg, animal husbandry professor, will be the department superintendent of Swine and Boys' Pig Show. D. W. Williams, vice-president for agriculture at A&M, is chairman of the Advisory Committee.

In the fat steers open classes will be \$4,480 given in prizes. The Hereford breeding cattle premiums will total \$13,800 and \$2,000 for Polled Hereford breeding cattle. Prizes totaling \$3,760 will be given in the department of Shorthorn breeding cattle. Aberdeen-Angus breeding cattle premiums will total \$7,580. In the department of dairy cattle \$2,719 will be given. \$4,288 in prizes will be given in the sheep and Angora goat division, and swine premiums total \$5,660.

The Fort Worth Show will sponsor a livestock judging contest. There will be a general livestock judging contest for senior agricultural colleges, general livestock judging contest for junior A. & M. colleges and teachers colleges, a Southwestern dairy judging contest for senior agricultural colleges and an intercollegiate meat judging contest.

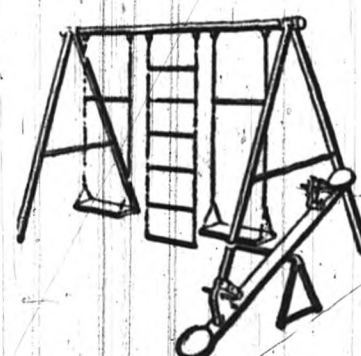

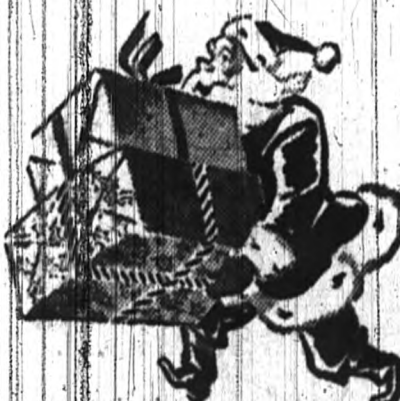
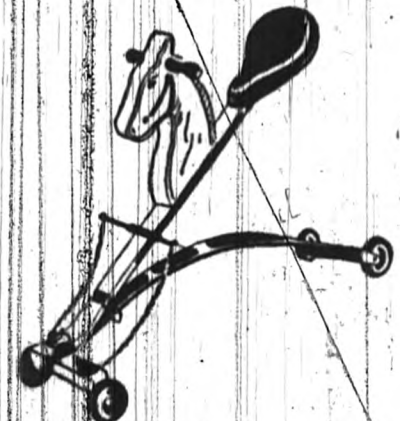
