Grant to Be Used In Brush Research

A grant of \$1200 from the Dow Chemical Company, Midland, Michigan, to the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station will be used in the Department of Range and Forestry to study the eradication and

control of certain undesirable brush species through the use of chemicals, according to Dr. V. A. Young, head of the Department of Range and Forestry.

This grant will enable the department to offer a fellowship to a graduate student who will study the effectiveness of chemicals in the eradication of given browse species on Texas ranges at a different season of the year.

Furthermore, the relative cost of quantitative applications when applied during certain seasons will be investigated.

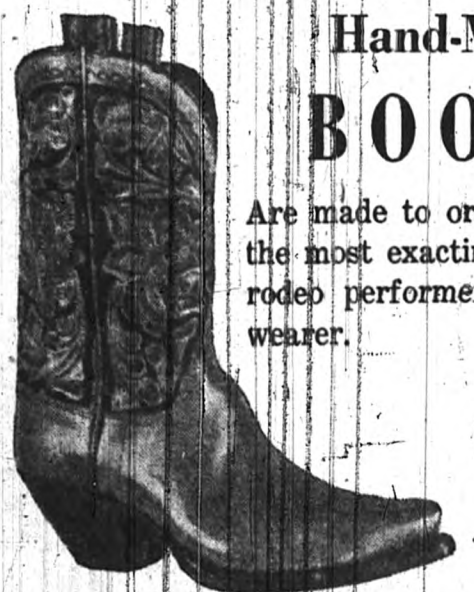

4 Staff Members Leave for Kansas

Four staff members from A. & M. left Monday to attend the North Central Weed Control Conference to be held in Topeka, Kansas, December 10-12.

They are R. R. Lancaster, Extension Service pasture specialist; H. E. Rea, agronomist with the Agricultural Experiment Station; F. R. Anderwald, field leader in the brush eradication control program in the range and forestry department; and C. E. Fisher, assistant soil conservationist with the Agricultural Experiment Substation at Spur.

The group will stop over at Manhattan, Kansas, to visit research and Extension leaders at Kansas State College. They will discuss methods used in Kansas for weed control, especially that of bindweed.

The staff members will return to College Station December 15.

Market Research Pushed by College

The most economical packaging and consumer preference for tree-ripened peaches was studied by the Marketing Research Group of A. & M. which met Thursday December 4, with Clayburn Ross, representative for the A&P Food Stores of Nashville, Tennessee.

The A&P Stores and the group here will work together on further experimentation. If successful, they expect to include other fruits and vegetables along with poultry and eggs.

Junior Agricultural Economics and Marketing students interested in this type of work should be able to receive summer employment with the A&P, Ross said.

Members attending the meeting included Dr. L. P. Gabbard and Dr. R. L. Hunt of the Agricultural Economics Department.
