Roads, Resources **Cause Farmers Not** To Return to Farm

Poor roads, lack of electricity, and unattractive living conditions are the leading reasons cited by Texas farmers why veterans and other young people do not want to go back to the farm.

Joe R. Motheral, economist in rural life at A. & M., says in a report on trends in Texas, farm population that these were the main reasons suggested by a number of correspondents in a poll taken recently among 469 farmers in 47 Texas counties.
