Ministers All the Way Back

Lutheran Pastor Plans Chapel, Student Center, and Parsonage

"You can't possibly appreciate the friendliness of the Aggies until you have visited another college," says Fred Mgebroff, local Lutheran minister. "I have never seen a college that compared with the common courtesy shown at A. & M."

Rev. Mgebroff is the descendant of a long line of Lutheran ministers. His father was a Lutheran minister, and there were Lutheran ministers on his mother's side as far back as anyone has record. He was born and raised in Brenham and graduated from high school in 1924.

Since it was necessary for a student to have several years of Latin, Hebrew, and Greek, before entering a seminary, he attended the Texas Lutheran Junior College for four years before entering the Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. He selected this college because Dr. M. Reu, internationally recognized as an outstanding Lutheran theologian, was conducting courses in church doctrine and the art of preaching at Dubuque. After graduating with a Bachelor of Divinity in 1932, he took several correspondence courses in theological studies.

His first assignment was pastor for five and one half years of the St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Clifton, Texas. He was later transferred to the Zion Lutheran Church in Brenham where he served for nine and one half years. In July of this year, Rev. Mgebroff was called as full time student minister for A. & M. by the Student Service Commission of the National Lutheran Council. As a pre-requisite for this assignment, he attended two summer courses in specialized training for student and vocational counseling. After serving at this college for three years, he will be eligible for reassignment or a transfer to another college. He has served as part-time minister at A. & M. for the past two years. In addition to caring for the needs of the students, he will serve as pastor of the local branch of the American Lutheran Organization which holds services at the 'Y'.

The local Lutheran Organization has received a gift appropriation of \$25,000 from the Student Service Commission of the National Lutheran Council. This contribution will be used to construct a building on a plot of land located two blocks north of the postoffice. Included in the building will be a chapel, student center and parsonage. Construction will begin as soon as the architect, William Nash, completes the plans.

Rev. Mgebroff is a member of the Parish Education Committee of the American Lutheran Church. The purpose of this committee is to make plans for Lutheran Sunday schools, league and Bible schools throughout the American Lutheran Churches. In connection with this work, Rev. Mgebroff

spends much time in preparing visual aids for religious teaching. These aids consist of slides, charts, and collections of religious pictures.

He married the former Miss Edna Lammert of Clifton, Texas in 1933. They have a daughter who is attending Consolidated.

Rev. Mgebroff holds a student Bible class at the Annex every Sunday at 2:30 and worship services at 3:30. The Lutheran student association meets every other Wednesday night in barracks T-357.
