Grid Official Man Of the Year in SW

DALLAS — The downtrodden sports official—the guy who takes all the gripes of the fans—can gain heart from the action of the Texas Sports Writers Association in placing its accolade of "Southwesterner of the Year."

Official Jack Sisco, who was much in the news the past football campaign, being the target of a bottle barrage at the Texas-Oklahoma game and socking a spectator who used unkind words after the Southern Methodist-Arkansas contest, was selected by a unanimous, rousing vote at the annual meeting of the association.

The writers said they picked the veteran official for the honor because he "brought into the open the evil we know exists: the neevd gambler and the fan who can't stand to lose."

"If you (the spectators) do not plug for more sportslike conduct by fans it may result in the death of collegiate football," Sisco said in several speeches during the season.

Sisco has been a foremost crusader against the two greatest evils confronting the future welfare of our amateur sports, namely drinking and petty gambling.

Notre Dame Says That Grid King Is Decided on Field

SOUTH BEND, IND., Jan. 14 (AP)—Notre Dame, although defeated by Michigan in a post-season associated press poll of sports writers, says that "championships should be won on the field."

A Notre Dame official made that statement last night before about 1,200 persons at the annual football banquet at which Notre Dame was awarded the Dr. Henry L. Williams Trophy, symbolic of the National Football Championship.

The Williams Trophy was awarded Notre Dame on the basis of the associated press poll of sports writers at the close of the regular season Dec. 8. The post-season poll was taken after Michigan's stunning 49-0 victory over Southern California in the Rose Bowl Game January 1.

The Rev. John H. Murphy, Notre Dame vice president and chairman of the faculty board of control of athletics, took cognizance of both polls in a speech in which he declared:

"I am sure that you and I and millions of other football fans—as well as the University of Minnesota 'M' Club—have no reason to disagree with the voices of the nation's sports writers in the associated press poll at the end of the regular season, which has come to be accepted as the final word on this subject; and that we also heartily concur with the logical assurance of the AP that a post season poll was not intended to supersede the votes at the end of the regular season."

Turf Men Elect Jones President At Session Here

Gordon H. Jones of Dallas, aeronautics administrator, Civil Aeronautics Administration, was re-elected president of the Texas Turf Conference last night.
