



pressure drop below the normal output of 125,000 pounds of pressure per hour.

During the next 38 hours these boilers burned over 30,000 gallons of the reserve oil.

This was the longest period of time that the boilers were ever operated on the fuel oil reserve since they were converted to use gas in 1937. The last time the reserve was used in 1944, when it was necessary to utilize this fuel oil for a 4 hour period.

Hines has been with the college as supervisor of the power plant since 1927, when he came here from the Texas Power and Light Company. It was under his direction that the General Electric Turbo-Generators, which have served the college since 1930, were installed. His long background in power plant work covering 32 years, is in a large measure responsible for the efficient and orderly manner in which campus utilities are dis-
