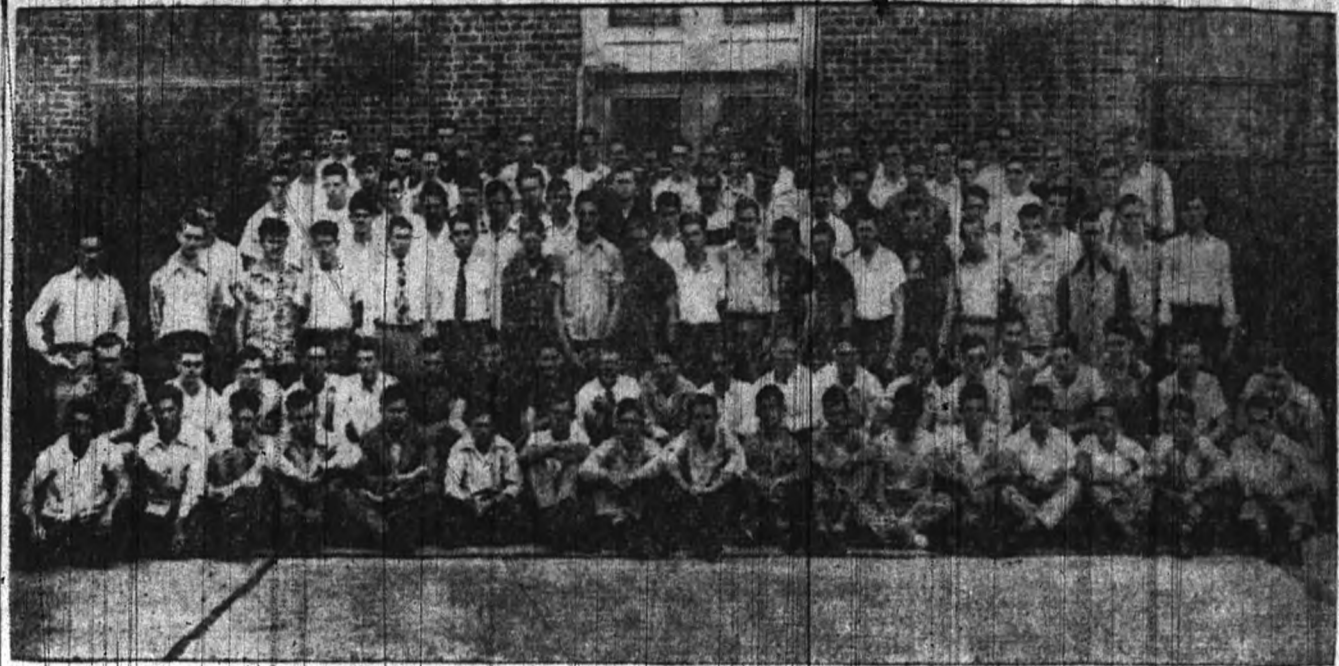


### Michigan Prof To Address Engineers

Dr. D. L. Katz of the University of Michigan will be one of the principal speakers at the conference on "Phase Relationships in Oil and Gas Reservoirs" being sponsored

by the petroleum engineering department April 7, 8, and 9. Six sessions will be held, including "General Phase Behavior of Fluids," "Vapor-Liquid Equilibria," "Water-Hydrocarbon Phase Relations," "Phase Densities," "Surface Tension and Viscosity," and "Behavior of Reservoir Fluids." Two hundred and fifty are expected to attend the conference.
