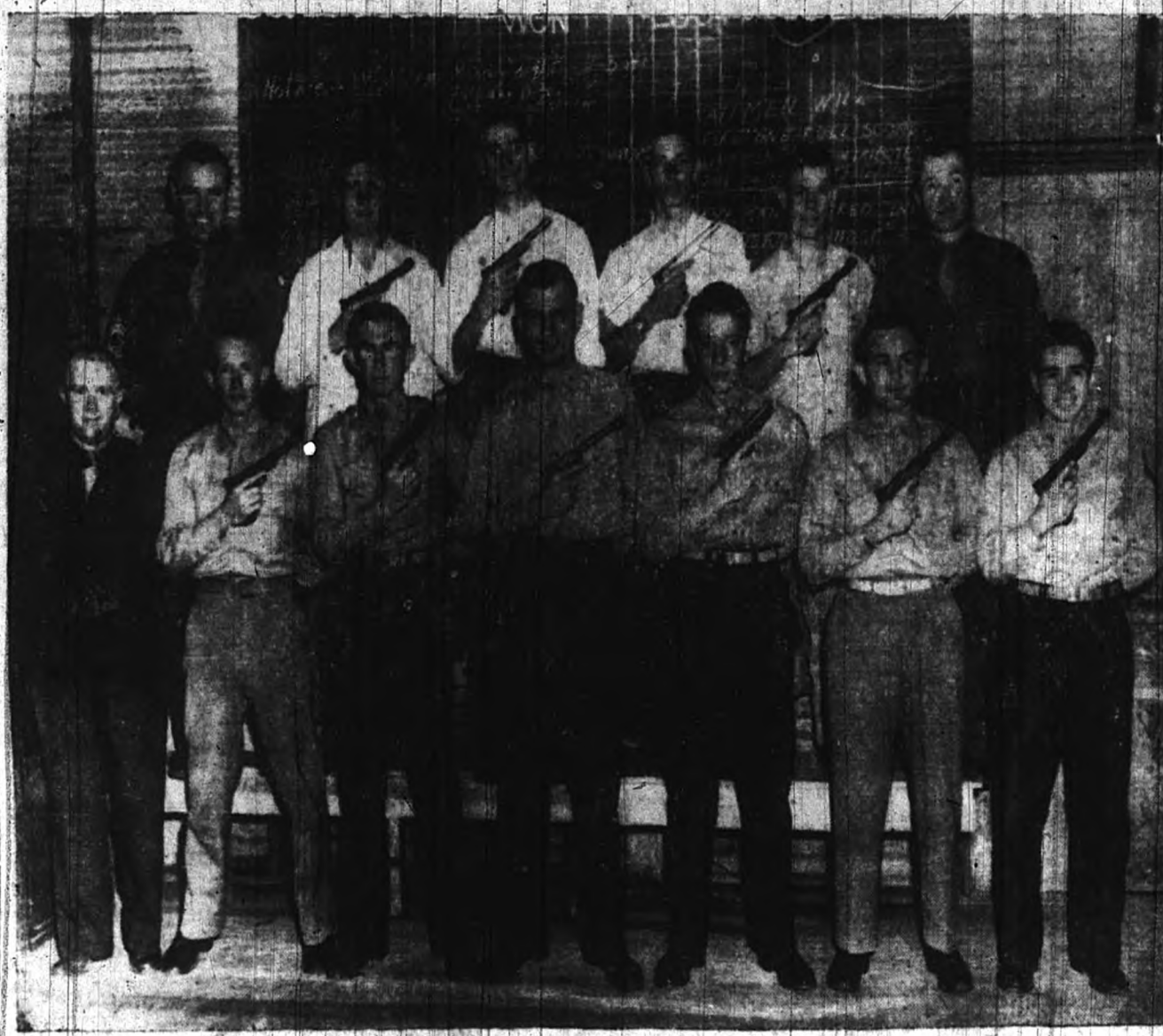
ERP SHIPS ALREADY CARRYING FOOD
