Weeds Controlled By 2, 4-D Without Damaging Crops

Tests conducted at the Beaumont branch of the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station prove that carefully controlled applications of the chemical 2, 4-D will control weeds in rice fields without damaging the rice or other crops in nearby fields.

Yield increases ranging from 3.5 to 12.5 bushels per acre were reported; decreased yields occurred when the 2, 4-D was applied at improper stages of rice growth.

Successful results depend on having reliable information as to the kinds of 2, 4-D to use, rates and dates to be put on, and care in application to avoid getting it on other crops liable to be damaged. A liquid spray is less likely to drift with the wind than is a dust form.

These experiments were conducted in the Texas rice area near Beaumont by Dr. Edgar C. Tullis, jointly employed by the Division of Cereal Crops and Diseases of the US Department of Agriculture and by the Agricultural Experiment Station.

Four forms of 2, 4-D were used: the triethanolamine, ammonium and sodium salts, and the butyl ester. They were applied from airplanes at various rates and during various stages of growth of the rice. The weeds commonly found in fields of that section are Mexican weeds and tall and curly indigo.

Details of the experiments are given in a report just released by the Agricultural Experiment Station at A&M.
