

# By Al Capp Education Bill Would Benefit Texans by \$11.90

WASHINGTON, April —(P)—
The Federal Aid to Education Bill passed by the Senate and awaiting final action in the House, would

be a big help in financing of local school systems in Texas. Out of a general appropriation of \$300,000,000 a year authorized by the measure, starting July 1, Texas would receive approximately \$11.90 per student between the ages of 5 and 17.

An idea of how Texas would fare under the formula: Minnesota

would get \$5.10 per student and Mississippi, \$28.50. In 25 states there would be a flat allotment of \$5 per pupil.

The measure would NOT interfere with the states in operation of their own school systems. Many southern legislators were worried at first that the bill could not be passed without granting the Federal Government power in such matters as race segregation. But no such restrictions have been written into it.
