

# Coke Truck Driver Deplores Balky Nickel-Taking Machines

Students and College employees send approximately 5,000 nickels rattling down into campus coke-machines every day of the week, according to Luke Patranella, the coke truck driver.

Whether or not 5000 cokes are delivered depends to some extent upon the mood of the machine and condition of the coin used. Cases have been reported of some machines, more cautious than others, which reject a nickel two or even three times, only to coyly accept the same coin on the next trial.

A repairman keeps close check on machines suffering breakdowns, Patranella says. Most breakdowns he blames on nickels hanging in the coin chute. Pennies dropped into the slot cause some trouble too, he added.

Two truck drivers are kept busy delivering cokes twice a day to the machines on the campus. Patranella says there are about 80 machines on the campus, most of them dispensing an average of 6 to 8 cases of coke each day.

Patranella's truck attracted wide attention last semester when a misprint was discovered in the advertising on one side. Instead of "Take Some Home," the sign read, "Take Some Home." Patranella said he was not acquainted with Smoe, that bewildered little man constructed of radio schematics who runs Killroy a close second in the decoration of otherwise drab washroom walls.

Patranella says 300 cases of coke bottles were lost last month. He requests that students leave empty bottles in the halls rather than in their rooms.

Not infrequently, Patranella finds notes from irate students attached to the coke boxes while making deliveries. He refused to divulge exact contents of the notes, but he did admit that when nickels hang in the slot, a machine might possibly take a coin without delivering a coke, and frayed tempers sometimes result.

## Exams to Be Given Seniors Who Plan Post-Grad Work

Graduating seniors who plan to do work toward advanced degrees have until April 15 to register for the graduate examination to be given May 3 and 4, Dr. W. A. Varvel of the department of education and psychology announced today.

The examination, which consists of two four-hour periods, is a series of objective tests in eight basic fields of the undergraduate curricula plus an advanced test in the student's major.

The examinations are prepared and scored by the graduate record office in New York and are given four times yearly. Reports of test results are furnished the student and the school he intends to enter. A fee of \$5 is charged the student.

Although A&M's graduate school does not require entrants to take the examination, Dr. Varvel pointed out that a number of the larger graduate schools require that the results of the examination be submitted with the student's entrance application.

## Penalty Set For Returned Checks

Any person cashing a check at the college confectioneries which is returned because of insufficient funds, account closed, no account, or any other reason in the control of the person cashing the check will pay a penalty of 25 cents.

The second returned check brings another 25 cent fine, and no more checks will be cashed for that person.

J. Wayne Stark, director of the Student Memorial Center and manager of the confectioneries, may waive this rule if convinced that the person cashing the check is not responsible for its non-payment.

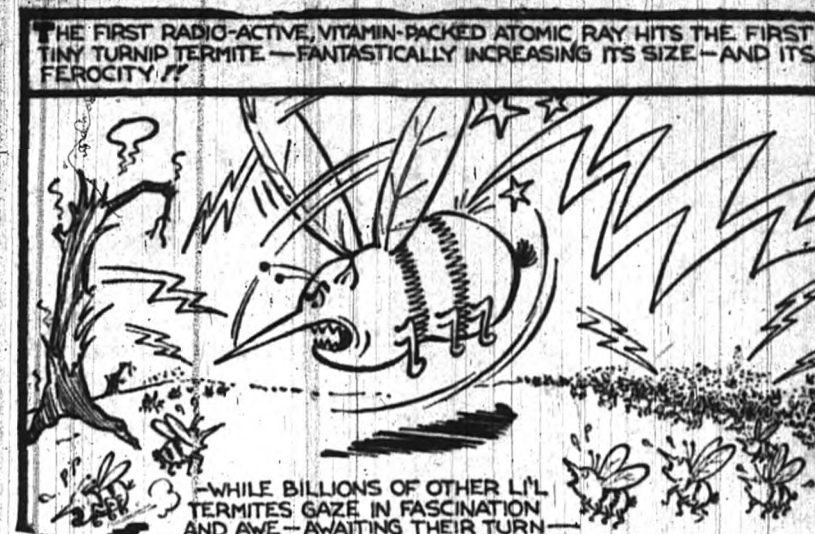

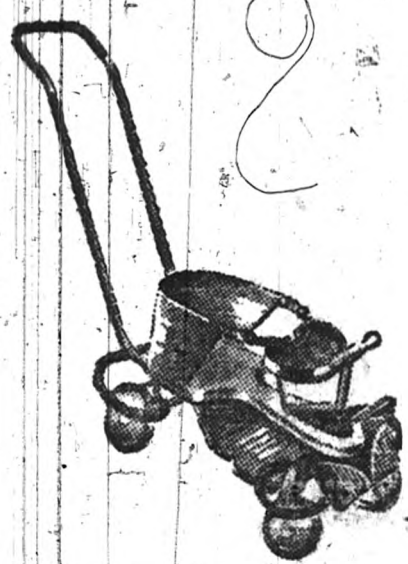
