'College of Life' Program Begun By Methodist Church

The A&M Methodist Church's College of Life Program is under way, according to Rev. Carlos Davis, pastor of the church. The fellowship program begins every Sunday at 6 p. m. with a general meeting, he said, and at 6:30 breaks up into three groups for study of different phases of Christian life.

J. Gordon Gray, secretary of the YMCA, teaches a class in "Protestantism," Otis Miller, instructor in the agricultural economics and rural sociology department, has a group for "The Christian in the New Age," and Rev. Davis instructs another group in "Getting Acquainted with the New Testament."

A review of the book, "While the Angels Sing," by Gladys Carroll will be given Sunday, April 18, at the 7:15 p. m. service by Mrs. Herbert Emery, Rev. Davis said. "Everyone is invited to attend the entire evening program and service," Rev. Davis said.

Variety Store Reopens at Gate

Pending construction of a new building at the North Gate, Taylor's Variety Store has been reopened in its old building, according to Mrs. Tom Taylor, manager.

The old white frame building, long a landmark at North Gate, will be replaced by a new brick and tile structure to be built for O. H. Boyett of Uvalde by Clarence Andrews Construction Company in Bryan.

Bryan Attorney To Address Pre-Law

Richard H. Cooke, Bryan attorney, will speak to the Pre-Law Society Monday night at 7:30 in the YMCA on "The Lawyer in Politics." Cooke, who recently formed a law partnership with W. R. Allen in Bryan, served as assistant to the attorney general of Texas from 1939 until his entrance into the navy in 1943.

Cooke became head of the oil and gas taxation and anti-trust division of the attorney general's office upon his return from the navy in 1945, a position which he held until resuming private practice eighteen months ago.
