The Cadet Corps will stage a formal review tomorrow afternoon and march en masse to the muster afterward. Luther Terry, chairman of the Muster Committee, said the general public is invited to attend the ceremony.

For the review, the adjutant's call will be at 4:25 p.m. The review is to honor students who are attending the Muster. At the same time eleven new organization colors will be presented to various outfits by the A. and M. Mothers' Club of Texas.

The Aggie Muster symbolizes the friendship and loyalty of A&M men to each other, to their Alma Mater, and to the state of Texas. A huge crowd from over this section of the state is expected to attend.

Colonel Meloy, commandant, has invited the four oldest graduates of A&M to inspect the Cadet Corps at the review. The Muster Committee has sent letters to 37 newspapers of the state inviting them to send representatives to College Station for the San Jacinto Day ceremony.

Terry reports that the record made to use for the broadcast in case of inclement weather came out very good. Terry has also received a letter from Karl Hiltz, owner of Interstate Theatre Circuit, Inc., saying that he was

attempting to interest one or more newsreel companies in covering the Muster Day activities.

The Muster will open with the Aggie Band playing "The Mad Major." Cliff Harris, corps chaplain, will deliver the invocation, and John Stiles will give the April 21 Muster Tradition.

After the Singing Cadets' rendition of "The Twelfth Man," A. E. "Red" Homan, Class of '25, will speak. The Aggie Band follows with "The Elder Statesman," and Sam Hill, A & M chaplain, will speak.

Proceeding roll call for the absent by Charles Harrison, the student body and the Singing Cadets will join together in "The Spirit of Aggieland." A military volley by the Ross Volunteer squad, Silver Taps, and Aud Lang Syne complete the program.

The muster committee is made up of Luther Terry, chairman, Charles Kirkham, Tom Laros, and W. W. Gardner.
